- A new guest dining room that seats 45 people was built from the ground up, wired and painted.
- A beautiful map of the world was painted in the new meeting room (still unfinished) above the guest dining room.

Spotlight Child


Abigail Gonzalez Hernandez born February 13, 2005.

We would like you to meet the littlest angel here at Casa Hogar Benito Juarez A.C. Abby, as she is very affectionately called, is a 5 month old Chinanteco Indian baby whose 20 year old single mother is unable to care for her.

As you may well be able to imagine, Abby has everyone wrapped around her little finger, and has no lack of people who are willing to cuddle and love her.

Her primary care-giver here is Jacinta, who is wheelchair bound and is our breakfast cook. Abby's mom visits her for a few hours each Sunday and is working as a live-in domestic. Since she has less than a 6th grade education, jobs for her are very limited and low-paying. We are encouraging her to work toward her GED in hopes that this will open doors for her in the future.

Abby already seems to understand and respond to English, Spanish and Chinanteco, so will most likely be tri-lingual from a very young age. It will be interesting to see God's plan develop for her life! Abby is in need of sponsors.

- Guest housing was finished and has been home to over 200 guests this summer.
- The children's library and study area has been painted and organized.
- An access ramp was built up to the meeting room, making all of the 2nd floor handicapped accessible.
- The guest bedroom, guest laundry room and new boys bathrooms have been painted, had electrical work done & dividers installed, and are getting LOTS of use.
- New screens were assembled and placed in all the windows.
- The storage room was completely emptied out, cleaned, and organized,
- The work area & shop were cleaned out and re-organized, storage shelves were built, after five truckloads of "stuff" were sent to the dump.
- The medicine cabinet was cleaned, sorted and labeled.
- Fran and Carol's house had the bathrooms painted, the molding sealed, window frames sanded & sealed and a enclosed laundry facility built plus a gazebo was constructed for outdoor dining.



And MOST importantly, the children got TONS of love and attention and were able to go swimming, to the zoo, to the movies, and out for a taco feed, as well as have a pizza party & a fun birthday party, have vacation Bible school, do daily craft activities and receive art classes and English class, coupled with lots of singing and learning how to play cards games.
